I'm pleased to report that we've secured a new meeting hall for our once-a-month-on-a-Saturday-afternoon meetings beginning in January 2022. After an exhaustive search looking at dozens of venues we were fraught with frustration over unbelievably expensive rent, Covid closures, ridiculous usage restrictions and rental insurance requirements but we've managed to secure the Dracut American Legion downstairs meeting hall just in time to avoid homelessness when the Lowell VFW closes this coming January.

The Dracut American Legion, located at 574 Broadway Road in Dracut is located four miles west of Route 93 on Route 113. We're going to meet in the downstairs (lower) hall which accommodates up to 50 people. There are no stairs to climb as the room entrance is located in the rear of the building at ground level with plenty of parking nearby. Room ambiance reminds you of the Lowell VFW so we'll feel right at home. You may view pictures of the lower hall by looking at the Dracut American Legion website (which is www.dracutamericanlegionpost315.com) and navigating to the 'Hall Rental' page or see page 10 of this newsletter.

A bonus for us is that normally the DAL is closed on Saturdays until 4pm so we'll have the building all to ourselves (meaning quiet and no interruptions) as they've agreed to help us out by opening for only us that afternoon.

As of the date of this article (11/01) the DAL is planning to have their bartender open up for us and then stay at the bar, located at the rear of the room just outside a set of double doors, to serve drinks as needed.

Another bonus this location offers for the Dunkin's folks is the proximity of two Dunkin's close by. One is located two miles east as you head back to Route 93 and the other is located one mile west near Dracut center.

We have a copy of the DAL agreement and have made the \$1200 payment (\$100 per meeting for four hours usage each month) so we're good for a year. Outside food may be brought in but we must buy drinks from their bar.

As we approach the coming new year we'll send out directions to the new location. For some it may be more difficult to get to but for others it'll be easier. It's fairly close to Lenzi's (site of our Christmas parties), too. Paul

This helps me with the groundwork of planning what paints I want to use, the materials needed for my builds, parts and pieces needed like custom wheels or parts from my parts box that I think I may have. If those parts are not in there, then I have to find them elsewhere or go without them. I also have to figure in those builds that I definitely have to do such as the Jaguar XK-E Coupe and the '30 Ford Model A Coupe.

So, what do I have coming up for the remainder of 2021 and now 2022? I have the AMT 1988 Ford Mustang GT that I will turn into a 1991 Mustang GT from the TV show 'Stumptown'. I still want to build the Revell of Germany Mercedes-Benz AMG GT that I bought several years ago. I have McNally, Boston PI stories to go with these if I choose to do so. Speaking of McNally, Boston PI, I have Lt. Detective Adam Troy's Dodge Charger Detective's Car yet to build.

I also have the Revell 1968 and 1969 Chevrolet Corvettes that I want to build as well. I haven't decided on a color for the 1968, but I am leaning towards a metallic blue and the 1969 will be gloss yellow. I am not a fan of the high rise hood on the 1968 'Vette, but I was able to get an AMT performance hood from the late Barry Fadden and I have been spending a little time on that hood getting it to fit on the Revell body. I also have the Tamiya Ford GT that I would like to build next year in 2022. I have a can of Tamiya Blue Pearl reserved for that model.

Sitting on the parts shelf is my Revell '69 Boss 302 Mustang that I need to finish. All I have to do is repaint the hood, apply decals and Bare Metal Foil and it is done. I also have the AMT '53 Studebaker that I started several years ago and never finished because I ran into issues with the front suspension and engine mounts. I should spend more time on that one. Additionally, I also have the AMT '70 Challenger R/T and the Revell '71 GTX on the bench that both need to be finished as well.

Kit review: AMT Ford Econoline Phantom Van by Associate Treasurer Tim Rhine

Kit review of the 1/24th AMT Ford Econoline Van 'Phantom' (AMT kit number AMT767 released in 2013)

This is the same Ford Econoline Van kit that has been released a number of times over the years, each time with a different theme (Disco Van, Coca Cola, Phantom, Hyper Hut, Matilda, Cruising Van, Surfer Van and a few other iterations as well). All versions are the same kit but with different building options and decals.

I chose this kit because I liked the theme. It has a minimal but cool decal sheet. Considering how old this kit is and the age of the moulds there is very little flash.

This kit version may be built stock or custom. Supplied are two sets of wheels and four rubber tires as well as an option for body side windows with both clear and tinted glass options.


The chrome tree is small with only a few chrome parts including bumpers, mirrors and factory hub caps.

The instruction sheet is the basic AMT version with part numbers identifying parts but the parts on the trees are not numbered so...it is not well thought out.

For my build I will be using custom wheels (e.g. wheels not included with the kit).

Overall so far it looks to be a good kit. Until the next review...happy building and be safe, Tim

Kit review: VW T2 bus by Associate Treasurer Tim Rhine

Next up is my review of the Revell of

Germany kit no.07667; the Volkswagen T2 bus. This offering is part of the new 'easy-click system' line Revell has put out over the last few years. The kit includes 109 parts and was released as a completely new mold in 2021. Kit parts are molded in four colors (orange, black, white, gray) with clear glass and includes decals, a choice of stickers for the first time builder and five rubber tires.


This kit is from an excellent mold as there was absolutely no flash and only two mold lines on the back of the body.

This kit is very detailed for a press fit kit. I would say that press-fit/snap-fit kits have come a long way so don't overlook them. If you built it 'out of the box' using the stickers it still would be a nice shelf model.

Currently (10/11/21) I'm halfway through building and it should be completed by our November meeting for viewing at our Show-N-Tell event.

I highly recommend this kit.
